CALL MEETING TO ORDER

Gretchen Sampson, president, called the meeting to order at 1:30 p.m.

APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA

BOARD RENEWALS & NEW APPOINTMENTS

Joan O'Fallon reported that term renewals were approved by the Polk-Burnett Electric Cooperative board at its June 24 regular board meeting for Gretchen Sampson, District 2; Elvira Schmidt, District 6 and Ed Peterson, District 8. New terms run 2024 – 2027.

O'Fallon also reported District 9 Director Kelly Bertuleit resigned and a new director, Diane Lund, was appointed by the electric co-op board.

A motion was made by Ed Peterson and seconded by Diane Lund to nominate **Elvira Schmidt for secretary-treasurer**. Nominations closed. Unanimous approval.

DELEGATE AUTHORITY TO ADMINISTER SECRETARY/TREASURER DUTIES

A motion was made by JoAnn Kipping and seconded by Elvira Schmidt to delegate day-to-day administrative duties of the secretary/treasurer to Polk-Burnett's communications director and manager of finance and accounting. Motion approved.

ANNUAL POLICY AND BYLAW REVIEW

The board reviewed policies and bylaws. No changes.
